

The Day the Churches Burned Sunday, August 23, 1931



On that day, Phil Barton, superintendent of the Sunday School of the Presbyterian Church, had just said the benediction for the Presbyterian Sunday School. Approximately 60 people had attended and most of them walked the block over to the Methodist Church to attend worship services, for the Presbyterian Church had services only when the minister from Henderson came to Kilgore.

Fifteen minutes after the Presbyterian Sunday School benediction, the roof of the Presbyterian Church, a weather -beaten structure more than 50 years old, caught fire. Rev. Dent hastily dismissed the Methodist worship service and the men rushed out to help fight the fire.

Begrimed oil field workers dashed into the burning building. They managed to bring out the old oak pulpit, the shiny new upright piano, a desk and a few hymnals before the roof fell among the pews.

The Methodist Church was only one block from the ashes of the Presbyterian Church. The large frame structure which the Methodists had built only 16 years before was a mass of fire before hotel attendants next door turned in the alarm. Not one stick of furniture-not even a hymn book-was saved.

Weary firemen had barely smothered out the last embers of the second church fire when another alarm was sounded from a cottonseed storage house about three blocks away on the opposite side of the railroad track. The seed house was behind a garage belonging to Trip Elder on the street paralleling the north side of the railroad track. This was quickly brought under control.

To this day, the series of five fires remains unsolved. The consensus is that some unknown oilfield worker or workers, disgruntled by the loss of jobs under the new proration order, set the fires.

For the Methodists, it was as if the flames of the burning church building ignited a fiery new zeal within the congregation. Attention turned again to the needs of the Lord's work. At the Fourth Quarterly Conference on October 11, 1931, a building committee was appointed, consisting of Roy H. Laird, Mrs. Nell Hamilton, Mrs. Lynch (Jessie) Reynolds, J. A. Knowles, John Henry Laird, and Mrs. S. G. Andrews. On December 8, the name of L. P. Griffin, Jr., was added.

All assessments for the year were paid in full, including the pastor's salary of \$1,800. The Woman's Missionary Society, under the strong leadership of Mrs. S. G. Andrews, grew to a member-ship of 25 divided into two circles; and Rev. Dent, now much encouraged, wrote, "We feel that their efforts are going to be worth much in replacing our church."
