



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

Philippians 4:6-7

The first time that Sabrina and I moved as a married couple, it was nerve-racking. I was serving at my first Student Appointment while working my way through my undergraduate degree and then starting seminary. During that time, Will was born and shortly before we were set to move to a new appointment, Wesley was born. Sabrina and I had moved before, but this time was different. Now instead of it just being the two of us, we had a family to contend with. We had a 2-year-old and a barely two-month-old. To say anxiety was high is an understatement. Change is hard. Uncertainty is harder. Change and uncertainty when it involves someone or something you deeply care about can almost be crippling. I would love to be able to say that we handled the move well. I would love to say that Paul's verse in Philippians helped to ease our anxiety, but it didn't.

The anxiety was there and there was no denying it, but looking back I can now tell you that while change and uncertainty are hard, making it to the other side of the first move has helped my perspective greatly. We made the move and as we settled into the new house and new way of life, I discovered that while it was different, we were ok. It was much easier to understand the words, 'Do not be anxious', when we had lived to see the other side. But the faithfulness of God during my period of uncertainty during our first move has helped with every other change I have experienced since then. Seeing God move in my life in the past helps me to see that God is working even into the future when I don't always understand it.

There is a great deal of anxiety about the future of the United Methodist Church right now. News stories are seemingly making the future look bleak and grim for a denomination and a church that many of us have grown up in and call home. There is a great deal of change and uncertainty in the future and we are feeling that pressure. General Conference meets in May and at that time, the future of the church will be decided. There will be nothing official until that point which means we have a few more months of waiting.

But as we go through this season of anxiety and waiting, I would encourage you to look back to those times in life when God delivered and provided in ways you did not expect. Think of times when God eased your anxiety and was present with you. As you think to those moments, remember that the same God that was present before, is present in our future. Give your anxiety to God and believe that even in uncertainty, God is still God and is still leading our future.

NEW SOUND AND MEDIA SYSTEM IN SANCTUARY

On December 26-27, Mundt Music installed our new audio and media systems, replacing our broken 1998 sound system and temporary media set up.

The church staff and Board of Stewards worked hard on the specifications and funding for this project. All the components are paid for through our endowments. What a great testament to the power of giving to the church through funding endowments for future needs and ministries! Many of these funds were given in the wills of our past members. Something to think about for all of us present members!

We have already been given a lot of positive feedback about how much cleaner the front of the sanctuary looks, without all the extra equipment in the handicap seating and by the bannister. Even more positive are the comments of those no longer being blinded by the projector as they walk in from the hallway! One member liked the two screens because "someone would inevitably sit right between me and the screen" when we had one. Many members have commented on the better brightness of the new projectors. We have even had to change some of our backgrounds to accommodate this new feature. We can use darker backgrounds behind text now and not lose background detail. This will allow for easier text reading as the presentations adapt.


The new digital sound components replaced our 1998 analog sound board, equalizers, gates, compressors, and floor outputs. Multiple heavy copper wires were replaced with a single cat6 network cable.

The new media components included two ceiling mounted laser light source projectors and a new switcher. The laser light sources mean that we will likely never have to replace the lights in the projectors, saving us labor and scaffold rental in the future. The white color of the projectors blend them into the ceiling color.


