Mark 12:41-44

The Board of Stewards held their April meeting on Monday, April 19, 2021. It was an exciting meeting, as the topics included more items of the life of the church, rather than concerns of handling the pandemic. Still, along those lines, the Board discussed the possibilities of reinstating food and fellowship (you know us Methodists!) and determined the safety of wearing masks at one's own discretion. On other business, the broken pieces of plexiglass covering and protecting our stain glass windows have been replaced and the rest of the pieces have been checked to make sure they are offering the protection needed. Receiving a bid for the addition of electrical plugs to the chancel area of the sanctuary, eliminating the need for extension cords, had to be postponed until a date after the Board meeting; therefore, it will be business handled in the next meeting. The necessary repairs to the parsonage that were discussed in last month's meeting have been made.

The new business brought before the Board included an in-depth discussion of a master plan dealing with the addition of more security cameras to our campus. Presently, we have cameras that cover activity in the children's courtyard and the business and financial offices. Bill Bryant and Scott Gibson provided the Board with a plan for systematically adding cameras throughout the campus, beginning with the Activity Center (Gym) and then moving to include the Sanctuary, followed by inclusion of the Family Center and more of the outdoor areas. These cameras will be able to be monitored by the ushers during services as well as staff and volunteers at any time. The Board decided to move forward with the first stage of the plan including the Activity Center because the proceeds of the Ballard Fund are already enough to cover the expenses. (The Ballard Trust Fund was set up cover expenses of the Activity Center.). The other stages of the plan will be implemented as monies are secured for them.

The Board also received, discussed, and decided to move ahead with two requests submitted by Misty Shipman. Misty brought to our attention that additional mulch needed to be added to the playground areas to keep the playgrounds safe and up to standard codes. Misty also requested that the Board investigate the building of a ramp that will make the children's courtyard more accessible. The need for the ramp has been noted during MDO, during Sunday school and during the regular cleaning of that area. Investigations of how to proceed with that have already begun.

Permission was also granted to Nikki Chowdhury and the youth to hold the Flamingo Fund Raiser to help defray costs of summer camps and summer mission opportunities for the youth.

The next meeting for the Board of Stewards is scheduled for Monday, May 17, 2021.





MASK UPDATE

Throughout the Coronavirus Pandemic, the Board of Stewards has been working to ensure that we were able to meet and worship as a church in the safest way possible. We have seen improvements in the pandemic in our area over the last several weeks. The number of people being vaccinated has increased and even with the lifting of the state-wide mask mandate, we have seen no noticeable increase in cases in our area. With that in mind, the Board of Stewards has removed our mask policy. We are no longer requiring masks to be worn at church events. 
