AUGUST 23, 2021

The Board of Stewards held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, August 23, 2021. The Board always welcomes and appreciates any concerns, requests, and questions from members. The first section of each meeting is devoted to anyone who wishes to express input. After the opening prayer, Tonya DeKoker and Amanda Gillen-Hall expressed concerns about the "disappearing youth" at the church. In spite of excellent programs and activities being offered, numbers have dwindled. Suggestions were made about taking a closer look at the situation and determining ways forward. The Board was then brought up to date on matters of finance including repairing the van from theft of its catalytic converter (covered by insurance), expanding our internet capabilities for the same price as before, touching base with the air conditioner providers to ensure proper maintenance is being done, and suggesting all service contracts be renegotiated to ensure the best coverage and price. The Endowment reports showed that, although July was not as profitable as other months, all endowments are healthy. Projects around the church are continuing to be worked on and completed. New business included suggesting that the Employee Handbook and Employee Job Descriptions be updated. This will involve congregational input as to the vision of the future of church programs as well as committee work about how to make that vision a reality. Be watching for more information and opportunities to participate and be heard. The meeting concluded with a prayer.

"Do not fear the king of Babylon, of whom you are afraid.

Do not fear him, declares the LORD, for I am with you,
to save you and to deliver you from his hand."

Jeremiah 42:11

As I am sitting here writing this article, we are facing a great number of issues. The fourth wave of Covid is moving throughout the nation. Hurricanes and other natural disasters are wreaking havoc across our hemisphere. War and the after effects of years of fighting are taking a toll, and political turmoil is affecting almost every level of government. It is easy to see that at this moment in time, there are a great number of reasons to be stressed and anxious. I am coming to believe that as bad as 2020 was, 2021 is shaping up to be even harder. I don't write these words lightly and I don't write them to cause panic. I say it as a present part of the reality that we live in. But we are not alone.

The passage above is a warning from the prophet Jeremiah to the people of Israel. The struggles they were facing were monumental and destruction of the nation seemed imminent. The people had many reasons to fear and panic, and if we were in their shoes, we would certainly feel the same way. But Jeremiah takes a different approach and tackles the problem head on. He doesn't tell the people to ignore the problem or pretend like it is not there. Instead he acknowledges the problem and reminds the people that as big of a problem as the king of Babylon might be, God is bigger.

This is the message I want you to remember today. Our reality is scary and fear inducing. It does us no good to pretend like covid is not real. It is, but there is a bigger message, God is bigger and we place our faith in the God that is bigger than anything that we face. Remember this as you make your way through the next month; when worry and fear begin creeping in, remember that God is bigger than everything else.
