

Preschool

We don't have to teach a preschooler to show everyone how big they are. And, if we're all honest, there's something deep inside us that wants to do something big, too. We want to show the world that we can do things that matter—things that really matter. Could it be that we were all made to do big things? We think so. That is why we have planned an entire month around what being a Super Kid really looks like—doing the things God made us to do. God made us to do BIG things!

Elementary

Elementary students will be studying the connection between individuality and God's character, as shown through God's big story. God is one of a kind, with no beginning and no end. The conversation around power and authority is tricky for teenagers who want to experience freedom and learn what a healthy relationship with authority means. In this series, we want teenagers to learn about authority and power from the best example there is, Jesus. In a world that is power hungry, Jesus demonstrates the way of the upside down kingdom by using His power to love.

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Hebrews 13:8

I always heard the phrase growing up "The only thing certain in life is death and taxes." It took me several years to really understand the impact of this statement. As much as we crave certainty, very little in life stays the same or stays the way we want it to be. I think a more accurate statement would be "The only thing certain in life is death, taxes, and change." Change is never easy and typically requires that we let go of something familiar and something that we enjoy. Oftentimes change is thrust upon us and we have little say in the matter. Sometimes we change begrudgingly with little understanding as to why. While change is certain, it is not always something that we enjoy.

As we have started our fall programming around the church and prepare for Pumpkin Patch in October, it is exciting to see some of our favorite activities appear on the calendar again. It was great welcoming over 60 people back on Wednesday nights as we have a time of fellowship and Bible Study. But as much as there are some familiar activities on our calendar, there are also some changes born out of necessity. Both the pandemic and the looming city project that will make portions of our campus difficult to reach have made us modify many plans and change some things. It is not change for the sake of change, but instead, adapting so that we can still worship, fellowship, and engage in Bible Studies.

As I look at the calendar with both the familiar and changed activities, I am reminded there is one other certainty in life. Hebrew 13:8 reminds us that Jesus Christ does not change. While uncertainty might move around us and undesired change might come our way, Jesus is still here with us, just as he always has been. Change can be scary and difficult, but Jesus is bigger. When you feel your anxiety and frustration rise over changes, whether they are big or small, remember, Jesus is still with you and that will never change.


