

# 5 FROM THE PASTOR

One of the things I miss most during the summer around the church is all of the children that attend our Mother's Day Out Program. When MDO is not meeting the church campus is oddly quiet and still. When school is in session there is always noise, laughter, and excitement from the children as they play, sing, learn and go through their day. This school year MDO has been a little different. Covid has continued to create problems as teachers and students have had to miss school due to sickness and exposure, but even with the hecticness, it is still great to see all of the excitement.

Misty has done a great job at ensuring that MDO still happens and that there are plenty of teachers and subs to create a safe and fun environment. There is also a great deal of prep work that is required to create a safe environment. Sanitizing takes place as well as cleaning nap mats. Arts and crafts are laid out and snacks are prepared for the students to enjoy. In order to help with communication throughout the classrooms, we recently acquired more walkie-talkies so teachers could communicate without having to leave the classroom. The first day we went to use them, I took them off the chargers and immediately realized there was a problem. While they were charging, they worked, but the minute I unplugged them they died. This led to panic and frustration until I took the back off the battery compartment and realized that the batteries had not been put into the walkie talkie so no charging had taken place. It was an easy oversight but an important one.

I often wonder how many times we run around frantically trying to prepare and plan but face the same oversight. Without the batteries, the walkie-talkies could not be charged and so they were not ready when needed. We often stay busy and in doing so do not allow ourselves time to recharge. In Genesis, God rested after creation was done. The seventh day was a day of Sabbath. Sabbath is a day of rest where we allow ourselves to experience the goodness of God and allow God to charge us up to face the week ahead. Preparation and planning are important, but so is Sabbath. Are you giving God time to charge you up for the journey ahead?


