



7 GENEROSITY

Generosity is defined as the quality of being kind with your resources and abilities. Generosity is not simply about giving one time, but instead is a pattern set up in your life, of giving with everything that you have. This is not limited to just your financial resources but also your time and gifts. As we work through the month of February, we are going to be looking at what it is to give generously and how Jesus calls us to be generous. We are kicking off February with our Mission Weekend. This included Serve Day on February 5, and Mission Sunday on February 6. Serve Day is a great way to be involved in our community and around our church campus. We will have several projects for people of all ages and skill levels to take part in. On Mission Sunday we will celebrate the missions that we are engaged in as well as look forward to the year ahead. One of our primary focuses for the upcoming year, in both our financial giving and our physical service, is to focus on working with our students that are still struggling with the aftermath of the pandemic. Cynthia Mathis is a member of our Mission Team but also works in the school system and offered up this reflection.

"Just a dollar a day, less than the price of a cup of coffee, could save the life of a child, " I remembered these commercials from years ago when Mission Team was mentioned in church. I pictured books, water, food, scripture shared in foreign languages in distant places. Then Monday came, and there was a child with no backpack or supplies dropped off for their first day of school, another that needed to shower in the locker room and have his clothes washed so that he would not spend his day soiled and disheveled. These were not children in a distant place, not people from a third-world country; these were our neighbors. Children we pass on the street. We have all been impacted by the pandemic, closures, and sickness, but there has also been an increase in homelessness, domestic violence, and abuse during this time. Many of the children in our community suffer from food scarcity in the best of times; these are not the best of times. St. Luke's has long participated in a backpack program that sends home a bag of food with children on Fridays. Food that does not require a microwave or a can opener, food that the child can prepare and serve themselves. This is the only food in the home over the weekend for some. Church members have gone to campuses and read with struggling students, becoming mentors and adult cheerleaders for children that may not have many on their side. We have worked with Rahab to support women and children in our community. While the last few years have been more about social distancing than social support, the need in Kilgore has only increased as the focus has been driven inwards towards our health and safety.

I was excited to mission to people in need, share the blessings that God has given, and try to change a life. But I realized this week that it does not require an airplane trip. All around us, there are opportunities to share God's love, and the children in our community have never been as in need of support and comfort as they are now. November was a time for us to be thankful for all of the blessings that we were given; December was a time to surround ourselves with friends and family; perhaps now is the time to look outward, to use those gifts that we have been given to change the life of a person down the street. Now is the time to put those blessings to use to serve God and our community. This year we can dedicate ourselves to shining God's love into the lives of those around us that have too long been in darkness. How will you share your gifts, your blessings, with those around you? How will you challenge yourself this year to help those in need? How will you bring someone closer to God by sharing his love through your actions? Each of us can create a real change in the life of a child, but together we can support our community.



When The Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church merged in 968 to form The United Methodist Church, the new church adopted the "cross and flame" symbol. This emblem, which is seen on church signs around the world, illustrates that United Methodists relate to God through Christ (the cross) and the Holy Spirit (the flame). The two tongues of fire that come together as a single flame symbolize the two churches that came together to form The United Methodist Church. The flame also reminds United Methodist of the experience that John Wesley (the founder of Methodism) had in 1738 while listening to a preacher at a meeting on London's Aldersgate Street. Wesley felt his heart "strangely warmed" and knew that he had been saved by God's grace.
