



HERITAGE Highlights

In 1934 St. Luke's installed a Wurlitzer organ in the new sanctuary. After many years of service the organ was completely worn out, beyond repair. In 1952 St. Luke's employed Roy Perry, talented organist at First Presbyterian Church of Kilgore, to design a new organ to fit the needs of the church. The Aeolian-Skinner Organ Company of Boston built the two-manual instrument for St. Luke's according to Roy Perry's design and it was installed by T.J. & J.C. Williams Pipe Organs of New Orleans.

The St. Luke's Sanctuary and Alexander Education Building house over 28 stained glass windows. This includes 3 large character windows. The stained glass images were created by the St. Joseph Art Glass Company in St. Joseph, Missouri, and transported to Kilgore on the Missouri Pacific Railroad. The entire project cost around \$1,500. In our archives we have hand drawn images, telegraph messages, and letters pertaining to the project.



At Mission Sunday on February 6, we were blessed to hear from Dr. Cindy Lindley, principal of Chandler Elementary School, about the impact that the St. Luke's Backpack Program has had in the school. The program provides easy to eat food for 36 students each weekend. Misty Shipman & Niki Chowdhury have spent countless hours setting up this program and partnering with The East Texas Food Bank to get the food into the hands that so desperately need it. The Backpack program costs \$1000 a year to run and as a designated St. Luke's Fund, it is not part of our yearly budget. The funds come from grants and from contributions from our congregation. On Mission Sunday we raised \$400 to help support this ministry.
