These woman are from all walks of life with a common purpose to see the body of Christ grow and love the unlovable.



Our iconic bell tower was named for J.A. & Mary Knowles in honor of their many years of service to St. Luke's. Mary Knowles, affectionally known as "Mollie", was the driving force behind the building of the new Sanctuary in 1915. She was also the longtime music leader, taught Sunday School, and participated in Women's Ministry. J.A. Knowles served in many areas of leadership in the church, including leading the Building Committee that built our Sanctuary & Alexander Education building. Most notably Mr. Knowles created an endowment fund in memory of his wife. The J.A. and Mary Knowles Endowment fund is still leaving an impact on the lives of Methodists today. St. Luke's receives a yearly residual from the fund and the United Methodist Church receives funds to administer a nationwide Educational Scholarship. Administered by the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry (GBHEM) Office of Loans and Scholarships, the J.A. Knowles Scholarship is awarded annually to students who spent their high school years as residents of any orphanage, children's home or foster care in Texas. It is a generous scholarship that offers significant assistance in helping students fund their education.


