

HERITAGE Highlights

On Sunday, August 23, 1931, the history of the Kilgore Methodist Episcopal Church South changed forever. It was on this day that the small white wooden sanctuary that housed the congregation burned down in an act of arson.

Five fires were set that day, destroying the Presbyterian Church, The Methodist Church, a cottonseed storage house and damaging the Dublin Grocery Company and an abounded building. All five fires were started with gasoline soaked trash ignited and placed under the buildings.

For the Methodists, it was as if the flames of the burning church building ignited a fiery zeal within the congregation. Attention turned again the needs of the Lord's work. At the Fourth Quarterly Conference on October 11, 1931, a building committee was appointed, consisting of Roy H. Laird, Mrs. Nell Hamilton, Mrs. Jessie Reynolds, J.A. Knowles, John Henry Laird, and Mrs. S.G. Andrews.

On November 20, 1932 the new St. Luke's Methodist Episcopal Church South Sanctuary was opened for worship. Almost 90 years later and the Methodist congregation in Kilgore is still worshipping in that beautiful rock structure.


CONFIRMATION

What Lies Beneath?

About 20 years ago, I went to the theater to watch a supernatural thriller, What Lies Beneath. In the movie, Harrison Ford and Michelle Pfeiffer portray an extraordinary couple in which she is a beautiful cellist and he is a successful college professor. They live in a gorgeous house and are admired by their community. Of course, all of this is the early setting for the stark contrast which will come later: Ford's character is actually a cheating and murderous husband. In the movie, Michelle Pfeiffer's character barely escapes with her life. And the moral of the movie was clearly that looks can be deceiving and, as well, we often deceive even ourselves!

What lies beneath the veneer of our lives? We have our daily routines and responsibilities which we value and work hard to maintain. The basic framework for our living is the picture which defines for other people who we are, essentially. We likewise can only know so much about the people in our milieu. Appearances and actions are the major components for the basic understanding of a person.

In our honest moments, however, most of us will admit that, much like an iceberg, we are made up of deep layers that exist well beneath the surface awareness of others and even ourselves. (Only 10% of an iceberg is visible above the water line, and the other 90% lies beneath the water.) It often takes a traumatic circumstance or major life change for us to really look at the hidden compartments of ourselves and decide change is necessary.

The Apostle Paul taught in 2 Corinthians that when you become a Christian, old things pass away and all things become new. Wow! That sounds so immediate and easy, doesn't it? This can only be true, however, if we let Jesus address the hidden 90% of ourselves which may be hindering our Christian growth.

Becoming emotionally healthy in our spirituality is clearly something we all want for ourselves and the people we know and love. A necessary factor in living the full life for which God created us is the willingness to come out of hiding. Pretending that struggle isn't real only isolates us from the One who loves us most and would stop at nothing to bring healing and change. With this in mind, let us boldly step forward to God and present our entire selves to Him. God will gently mold us into works of art, using our flaws to refashion us into our intended createdness.

Jeremiah 18 "I went down to the potter's house and I saw him working at the wheel. But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as it seemed best to him."

What lies beneath the veneer? What needs to be reshaped? This will be our focus in our next sermon series beginning the last week of August and extending to September 4.


