PASTOR'S ARTICLE

Most of us only have negative models for evangelists, usually a street person yelling scary and condemning ideas or a family member who stressed a moralistic faith which seemed rigid and fear based. Let us free ourselves from these archetypes and remember that Christ presented himself as the way, the truth and the life. In his mission as God incarnate, he molded to the environment and needs of his people. Paul did the same, as we have studied. We also remember that the original disciples soon learned that they had to move beyond their Jewish identity and go where they formerly feared to tread, the homes of Gentiles and in the company of people considered ritually unclean.

Likewise, we have to put aside our self-perceptions and be flexible and willing. Here are some pointers for bringing Christ into the life of another:

1. Understand that your own life is a great part of your witness. If your relationship with Christ isn't vital, then you'll likely feel unable and even hypocritical when attempting to talk about Jesus, right?... Let's reexamine this assumption. People want to be in authentic relationships in which both struggles and progress are shared freely. We can admit our areas in need of growth and then covenant to humbly walk with another in the right direction toward Christ. It's never wrong to say, *"I need more of Christ in my life, or do you sometimes feel like something is missing for you?"* On the other hand, we might be very mature Christians who faithfully worship and continually grow in our faith. Regardless of where you fall in your faith walk, Jesus will use you to humbly and compassionately walk the road with others. So never pass up an opportunity God presents to you in the effort to offer Christ to all.

2. Realize that we earn the right to be heard by sincerely listening to others. Everyone has a story. You can't just blunder into a situation and callously share without listening. The Bible says that Jesus was a friend of sinners. That's our example—to be a friend, to listen to people, see where they are, and then take them where they need to go.

3. Recognize that people are looking for a cure. When you go to the doctor, you don't say, "I have cancer." Instead, you describe your symptoms. That's where most people live. They only see symptoms. *"I'm lonely.* I'm suffering from a broken relationship. I'm stressed. There's darkness within me that I don't know what to do with." How do we share Christ with someone who is overwhelmed with their symptoms? We know the ultimate cure. It's Jesus Christ. Jesus didn't die for their symptoms. He died for their sins. Yet, people don't wake up in the morning and think, "You know, I need to accept Jesus." They wake up with the symptoms, and so as people who are attempting to rescue those who are lost, we need to start with their symptoms, show them the disease (sin), and take them to the ultimate cure (Jesus).

4. Keep it simple. The Gospel is already simple. Christ died for our sins. He was buried. He rose again. We need to turn away from the things that are wrong in our lives, and accept what Jesus did on the cross for us and receive Him as Lord. Don't complicate it. So many times we throw in things like our denomination or other doctrines, or we use religious terms that a lot of people don't understand. We end up confusing them and creating barriers. Explain the Gospel in a way that people can understand.

5. Stress the love of God. John 3:16 says, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (NIV). It starts with love, and that's where we need to start. People know they've done a lot of wrong things, but they first need to hear that God is still and will always be open to forgiving them.

We love to share gossip. It's time to learn a new way. Let's share the best news ever, the headline that can never be surpassed but gets overlooked because it's not salacious or full of intrigue. Jesus has come, Jesus is here, Jesus will come again. Here and now, we can offer the Kingdom of victory through Christ. What is preventing us?

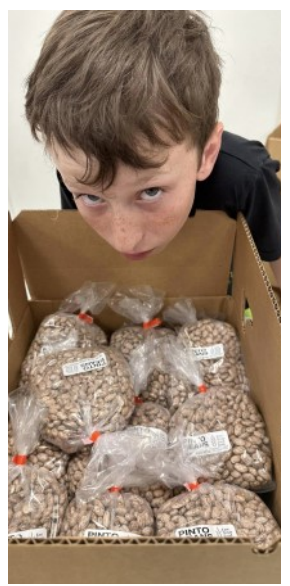

EVANGELISM

Hello, St. Luke's. I am Dean Miller, the King of this year's Evangelism Group. Our current members include me, Amy Bruyere, Bill Bryant, Kathe Miller, Laura Johnston, and Dennis Ellis (and we'd like to add you to our group. If you think you might have an interest in Evangelism PLEASE call one of us to talk about joining. We'd truly appreciate your help.).

What is Evangelism? "Evangelism" is walking alongside a person with love in an effort to bring to them a saving knowledge of Christ. Then, at the right moment (His moment), they can be transformed into His disciples. This can be done through relationship building, worship, information and many other avenues. Evangelism is not often the quick process of changing people, but rather it is helping them to walk into the opportunities He provides both to us and to them. The moment of their transformation is up to Him. Our responsibility is to provide the ambassadorship for Christ so that, in His moment, He is able to act to gather them in.

Being His able ambassadors is what we sincerely hope to accomplish this year – and we WILL accomplish that goal with (a) God's guidance, and (b) your St. Luke's volunteering help. St. Luke's has long been a fixture in Kilgore, TX. As has happened in so many churches, our membership and attendance has suffered although there are signs of recovery due yours and Allison's efforts. What must we do – not for St. Luke's alone, but what must we do for others that will lead them to Christ? Your Evangelism team would like to implement some BIG measures to bring more of our citizens to Christ. St. Luke's already hosts Pumpkin Patch, Mothers' Day Out, Youth Choir, etc. – all of which are highly important in our outreach. Still, the thought is, can we do MORE? Can we develop new ideas to reach out, and more importantly do we have the will, as a church, to reach out? Will we put forth the effort to do this? Will we get more involved in our prescribed mission as a Christian church, i.e., to bring the Good News to others. To do this, we must reach out even more to our fellow citizens here in Kilgore. We must bring to them opportunities and the avenues to come to know Christ.

Your ideas are vitally important, but, as we all answered in our Membership Oath when we joined St. Luke's, we must give "our Prayers, our Presence, our Gifts, our Service, and our Witness." (Remember? Our answer was - "I will.") We each and all need to become more vigorous in these

commitments. We desperately need a large St. Luke's participation to provide ideas and make our outreach thrust an effective one. We need phone callers, note writers, cookie bakers, advertising help, flyer distributors, folks who will contact other churches to invite them to join us – we need LOTS of you to join in a concerted effort of Evangelism. Are you interested? Will you be interested? Can you be counted on to join in the effort? We need people who like to fund raise (the older among us will remember Fulton Johnston and Willie Roberts), we need people who will make phone calls, we need people who will get in front of other people, and we need people to work completely behind the scenes. We need EVERYONE to will volunteer. We need to grow St. Luke's, but, most of all, we need to help more people be an active part of Christ's followers. To summarize, what do we need? WE SIMPLY NEED YOU!

Two community wide happenings are now soon to be held – (1) We're inviting the entire community to our Red, White and Blue Sunday. We will have lunch and a homemade ice cream contest and we're inviting the entire community to join us at noon on July 2 here at St. Luke's. Can you serve, scoop ice cream, purchase the bowls and plates, get flyers in stores, etc. etc.? We plan to publicize it to the community in many and varied ways.

Event Number 2 will occur soon after – at the City Park across the street on July 4, with our "Popsicles and Prayers" booth. Guess what? We need people to set up our booth, set up our Prayer Net, serve the popsicles, and, don't forget - folks to man the booth all day (in shifts of 2 hours). HELP!!

Let's get proactive. Let's BE proactive! Let's show people the JOY of our faith! Let's EVANGELIZE! We're St. Luke's, and we love you, and Christ loves you, too! You call us and you can work where you want to, or we'll be calling you and asking you to work where we need you.

It is with great excitement that Pastor Allison and I (Pastor Daniel) announce that we have officially launched our Pairs and Parents small group ministry during the 9:30 AM time between worship services in the Family Center. We recognize the vital need for intentional community, dedicated time of regular fellowship, and, honestly, a time to pause before the beginning of hectic weeks. This time is meant to reconnect a community of people in similar seasons in life, revitalize our discipleship ministries for adults and parents, and reignite the love and excitement that fuels our service to our church and the community. This space is designed for us to spiritually invest in our parents and young adults—people who spend every waking moment investing in others with little thanks! We believe this is an excellent avenue to reengage in our church community. DID YOU KNOW?

While St. Luke's MC has many great ministry opportunities, there is also some cost that we are responsible for as good stewards of the buildings and spaces that we have. Did you know that insurance for all four of our buildings, as well as the three church vehicles, cost \$30,000 a year? Your giving and contributions help us to have great ministries but also ensuring that our buildings and vehicles remain in good shape for years to come.

GIVING HELPS YOU FOCUS ON THE RIGHT THINGS

In Acts 2, we see a beautiful picture of how the early church operated. Early Christians were so set ablaze for Christ that they had no care for their earthly possessions, instead, they were overcome with love for God and their brothers and sisters. Ultimately, they were looking forward to their heavenly home and heavenly treasures.

All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Acts 2:44-45

Some people find it much easier to give than others do, and tithing is a great way to help you get into a healthy and Godly pattern of giving and releasing your earnings back to God.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT TITHING

What if I don't have very much money?

That's not really the point. Remember that tithing is 10% of your income. If you learn to give the "firstfruits" or first 10% to God it doesn't matter if that equals \$10 or \$10,000.

However, if you wait to tithe with what is left over at the end of the month you will probably find you never have enough to tithe. Tithing may require to you change some of your spending habits and even cut back on things you don't really need. If we are all honest, we can find lots of things that we spend money on that we don't need. Here's something

interesting to consider: people who don't tithe often say "I don't have any money" and those that do tithe say, "God always provides for all my needs and more!"

"But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a fraction of a penny. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on."
(Mark 12:42-44)
