How do you articulate or address our Creator? Most of us tend to call the God of the Bible simply "God." In scripture, God has more than a few designations. Yahweh, *Jehovah, or the LORD*. We remember also that Jesus called God Abba, Daddy.

In the midst of these options for addressing our heavenly father, we know that we are referring to One who is unmatched and wholly other. God reveals his name on a personal level for the first time in Exodus 3, when He calls Moses to free the people of Israel from captivity in Egypt. You may remember when Moses said to God, "If I come to the people of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" God said to Moses, "I am who I am." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel: 'I am' has sent me to you.'" That's an odd way to introduce yourself.

Matt Chandler of Village church wrote: "Now, when you're face to face with "I am who I am" — a God so powerful that pharaohs and kings don't stand a chance against him — *the natural question that comes to mind is, "Who am I?" That's a question we ask ourselves a lot, especially when we're facing adverse circumstances.* "In Exodus 3:11, Moses asked God this question, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?"

Now, If we were to judge Moses' resume, we might wonder why he considered himself a poor choice to deliver the Hebrews. He was in fact ideally suited for the job! He was fluent in Egyptian language, raised by the best tutors in Pharaoh's household, an expert on Egypt's culture and religion, and connected to the most powerful people in the land. He even had the blueprints of Pharaoh's house!

But God does not mention any of this. He doesn't give Moses a pep talk or assuage his fears with platitudes, "You're great Moses! You're a winner!" Instead, God tells Moses one thing: "I will be with you." (Exod. 3:12) And we are further comforted when we read that earlier in the chapter, God told Moses "I have seen the affliction of my people, heard their cry, and know their sufferings." God makes it clear that He had "come down to deliver them" (Exodus 3:7-8). The great promise of all of this is that "I am who I am" is with us. His presence is the answer to our anxieties and fears and the chaos of this world.

In the still heat of summer, when you sit and look at the vastness of our cosmos or the beauty of nature and wonder who you are within this framework of creation, remember that you are God's uniquely equipped child. You will be who you will be, within the grip of His guidance.

Speaking of names, one critical aspect of ministry is how we designate and describe what we are doing within the church. Our children's and youth ministry are being renamed—not simply because we're interested in having catchy words to excite people but because we want to capture the essence of what we want to accomplish in our young people's lives. Our young people are valuable members of our church; acolytes lead the ministers into our traditional service, our youth travel to other cities to help those in need, and all of our students are in various stages of their faith formation. As a church, we should recognize the needs that they have within their contexts and do our part to train them "in the way that they should go" (Proverbs 22:6). Our Children's Ministry is now IGNITION, and our Youth Ministry is BEDROCK.

IGNITION—In our church, we desire to see the seed of faith *ignited within our children. Children's Church on Sundays at 10:45 is a great opportunity for developmentally appropriate spiritual formation. Each service will model our traditional service: kids will serve as acolytes, demonstrating the presence of Christ in His Church and the power of the Holy Spirit moving among believers; our leaders will teach them eternal truths appropriate for their lives; and they will begin to learn some of the key beliefs of the Church. Sunday school, Sundays at 9:30, is another excellent opportunity for our kids to enjoy an activity or craft and be instructed in the facts of our faith.*

BEDROCK–After we've invested in the first several years of our kids' lives, they will move to our BEDROCK youth ministry. Here, we are laying and building upon the faith foundations that were ignited as children. Confirmation is the traditional bridge between children's and youth ministry—our youth are systematically taught the essential beliefs of the church and learn how to apply these beliefs to their personal lives. For our youth, we continue on Sunday mornings to train them in the Scriptures and doctrines, and Wednesday nights we enter into small group discussion so we can explore how we can impact our communities with Gospel truths. At St. Luke's we believe that the bedrock of the Christian faith for young people is (1) corporate worship with their parents or guardians in either the Arise or Traditional service, (2) being engaged with an element of fun, and, ultimately, (3) encountering the living God through sound biblical teaching.

For too long and in too many churches, student ministries have been purely dedicated to educating children. In igniting and building on the bedrock of our kids' faith, we are also *empowering them to take hold of their faith* and become leaders. In this, we believe we will see our students become full, faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, willing to "Love God; Live His Word; and Share His Grace." So, we are not just changing the name of our ministries. We are changing the nature of our ministries—reorienting them to reflect the historic church's desire to fully incorporate and utilize every single soul in Christ's body, the Church.

FIL Brokprok

Did you know that one in five Texas children live in poverty? The numbers are staggering and hunger is a reality for thousands of children in East Texas.

The Backpack Ministry allows our congregation to be in ministry with families in our community that may never know our names or step foot in our sanctuary, but are transformed by the love that we share.

Each week we provide non-perishable food items for children identified by school personnel to be at risk for food insecurity. On average we provide 50 meals a week during the school year, to students at Kilgore Primary School, Chandler Elementary, and Kilgore Intermediate School. That comes to over 2,000 meal kits each year at a cost of almost \$10,000. That comes out to about \$200 per child.

This ministry is important to our community and to our church. Being able to help without recognition and without reward, helps us to truly Share God's Grace. This year we are challenging our congregation and our community to help us Fill The Backpack, so that we can continue to provide food for kids in need. Each Sunday in the month of August we will be collecting funds and watching our Backpack fill up.
