THE CHOICE

Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ.

Colossians 2:23-24

I'm looking forward to our fall plans for Bible study, Wednesday gatherings for all ages, mission endeavors and so much more. I'm hoping to see everyone on campus for our Wednesday night programs and for Sunday morning worship and Sunday school. At the same time, I have seen in this, and in other congregations I've served, the common struggle to prioritize church worship and faith forming opportunities over sports, extracurricular lessons, hobbies, our own weariness, and the general demands of life. But I like the word "heartily" in the Colossians scripture above. It is a galvanizing word. We are reminded by Paul that we have the privilege to step forward into our faith life with excitement and gusto! You may not have thought about this, but the outside forces and opportunities of this life are in a race for your attention, and it is your job as a Christian to outpace their influence.

At the dawn of the Space Age it looked like the United States was losing the Space Race — and soundly. The Soviet Union had launched the first artificial satellite in 1957. In response the Vanguard rocket blew up on the pad.

Both nations then began to work on putting a human into space. The American Project Mercury was projected to put a man in orbit by late 1960, but delay after delay — sometimes out of caution and sometimes out of concerns for safety because the rockets continued to blow up, allowed the Soviets to put a man into orbit in April of 1961. The best the Americans could do, a month later, was to send astronaut Alan Shepherd on a fifteen-minute suborbital flight.

Yet on the basis of that suborbital flight, while American morale was low, President John F. Kennedy, at a Joint Session of Congress on May 25, 1961, committed the United States to landing a man on the moon by the end of the decade and bringing him back safely.

Some people questioned the sanity of this proposal. How could we talk about going to the moon when no American had even been into the orbit, and the Soviets seemed to be so far ahead?

Four months later, on September 17, with only one more suborbital flight to America's credit, and the first orbital flight still five months away, Kennedy spoke to an audience at Rice University and explained why this choice was so important. He said:

"We choose to go to the moon. We choose to go to the moon in this decade and do the other things, not because they are easy, but because they are hard, because that goal will serve to organize and measure the best of our energies and skills, because that challenge is one that we are willing to accept, one we are unwilling to postpone, and one which we intend to win, and the others, too."

Did you hear that? The president said that the reason for going was "not because they are easy, but because they are hard."

Joshua, the great leader of Israel once made a profound rallying speech. He gathered his troops and their families before a second battle that would occur against a foreign power, the Amorites. **Joshua demonstrated the same vi-**



sion as our former president in pointing out that the real battle is one that occurs in our minds. To the Israelites, Joshua essentially challenged his nation to recalibrate their worldview: choose God and God's will only, not because it is easy, but because it is right.

If we are unclear as we look at all of the demands on our time, then let us focus: "choose this day" who and what you will serve, to paraphrase Joshua, chapter 24.

I read this about the early life of the unmatched and world famous tenor, Luciano Pavarotti: "When I was a boy, my father, a baker, introduced me to the wonders of song," tenor Luciano Pavarotti relates. "He urged me to work very hard to develop my voice. Arrigo Pola, a professional tenor in my hometown of Modena, Italy, took me as a pupil. I also enrolled in a teachers college. On graduating, I asked my father, 'Shall I be a teacher or a singer?'

"'Luciano,' my father replied, 'if you try to sit on two chairs, you will fall between them. For life, you must choose one chair.'

"I chose one. It took seven years of study and frustration before I made my first professional appearance. It took another seven to reach the Metropolitan Opera. And now I think whether it's laying bricks, writing a book--whatever we choose--we should give ourselves to it. Commitment, that's the key. **Choose one chair.**"

"No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other." Matthew 6:24 There is urgency, and everything is at stake every day!

We don't like to think it, but our daily choices and seemingly insignificant choices DO have eternal significance.

The famous Christian author, C.S. Lewis wrote this about the final days of this life,

"When the author walks onto the stage, the play is over. God is going to invade, all right; but what is the good of saying you are on His side then, when you see the whole natural universe melting away like a dream and something else comes crashing in? This time it will be God without disguise; something so overwhelming that it will strike either irresistible love or irresistible horror into every creature. It will be too late then to choose your side. That will not be the time for choosing; It will be the time when we discover which side we really have chosen, whether we realized it before or not. "Today and every day is our chance to choose the right side.

Did you know that one in five Texas children live in poverty? The numbers are staggering and hunger is a reality for thousands of children in East Texas. Each week St. Luke's provides non-perishable food items for children identified by school personnel to be at risk for food insecurity. On average we provide 50 meals a week during the school year, to students at Kilgore Primary School, Chandler Elementary, and Kilgore Intermediate School. That comes to over 2,000 meal kits each year at a cost of almost \$10,000. That comes out to about \$200 per child.

This ministry is important to our community and to our church. Being able to help without recognition and without reward, helps us to truly Share God's Grace. This year we are challenging our congregation and our community to help us Fill The Backpack, so that we can continue to provide food for kids in need.

We are half way there!
As of August 16 we have raised or have a commitment for a total of \$5,163.


