# Who Are We.... these days?

Long gone are the days when society as a whole comes to church because folks are convinced that doing so will add value to the meaning of their life. Instead, there is a cultural mistrust that walking into a church facility, especially an historic one, will be an exercise in antiquated activities and thinking. There seems to be little expectation that what is offered on Sundays and Wednesdays (and everything in between) will deliver enough value to equal the effort or the choice to come on a church campus. We are faced with two problems these days:

- 1. Low expectations by our culture for the importance of faith and worship
- 2. No desire or sense of need to be an authentic Christ follower

These two factors drive my personal focus as pastor for St. Luke's in Kilgore, Texas. Day and night, I search my soul wondering what I can do better to be a bridge builder between Jesus as offered at St. Luke's, and the disinterested world beyond. I know that many who read this are also consumed with this central concern which defines our mission to offer Christ.

If we care about our faith and our purpose, I pose this unavoidable set of questions: In not now, then when?

If not St. Luke's, then why are we here?

I'd like to assume we care deeply about these concerns. If not, we don't stand a chance of helping establish God's kingdom, but should admit openly that we are comfortable with the idea we are going to allow ourselves to become an institution with the "form" of Christianity, but lacking the authentic "substance" of a vibrant calling to reach our world.

It has been said, "The demands of following Christ will cost you everything. But you gain far more than you give up. **You give up dirt for diamonds."** 

If you truly want to answer the question for yourself, "who are we, who am I?" Compare your motivations and actions to the first disciples. They serve as a plumbline, measuring where we stand individually and collectively as Christ followers.

<sup>18</sup> As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. <sup>19</sup> 'Come, follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people.' <sup>20</sup> At once they left their nets and followed him. <sup>21</sup> Going on from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, preparing their nets. Jesus called them, <sup>22</sup> and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him. (Matthew 4: 18-22)

# MINISTERING TO THE MODERN AMERICAN FAMILY

I would like to take a moment to answer two questions: What makes a family in our modern world? How can families spur one another along in faith growth?

God's design for the family is the same today as it has always been. Despite what our American culture may say and do, God's plan for the nuclear family has never changed: a father and a mother who love one another and who mutually submit themselves to one another and to the Lord and who, for the Glory of Christ raise their own children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. When one or more of these components is lacking or missing (as they often are in our world), it is the duty of the church to come alongside families by helping foster an environment where God is glorified and people are helped in their walk with Christ, and to do so without judgment.

If you are wondering where to begin as an individual, start with your own "family." How do you relate to the people in your own household? This is your "family"! Start by practicing kindness and forgiveness to each of them (Ep. 4:25-32). Practically for the Church, this means reaching families where they are. Such outreach does not have to be complicated or fancy. Taking note of practical needs, or what is called mercy, ministry is one of the easiest ways to inspire Christian growth in others.

I would like to challenge you to be Christ's hands to a single mother or father, or a child with no parents, or a family in financial distress, or an elder in a health crisis; invite them to dinner at your home or take them dinner! You don't have to make filet mignon. Beans and cornbread will work just fine. Pray with them over the meal and listen to them. Serve them. Love them. Talk to them about how the Gospel has changed your life. Our church can turn the world upside down with such "small" acts of hospitality, and we can redeem our culture in the name of Christ and for the sake of his kingdom. Amen.


# WEDNESGAY

# Brokprok MINISTRY

Backpack Ministry has started fast and furious this year. We are currently feeding 68 students each week.

On the fourth Monday of each month, the East Texas Food Bank delivers backpack kits to St. Luke's. We are responsible for unloading the pallet and moving the food into a food safe storage place. For us, that is the Library in the Family Center. We then organize the boxes for easy delivery. Each week Donnie Nicholson loads up 9 boxes of food and delivers them to local schools.

We are blessed to be able to support the children of our community through the Backpack program, but we couldn't do it without your support. In August we began a campaign to help us cover the cost of purchasing the food each month. Thanks to your generosity, we currently have receive donations and commitments totaling \$5,896.

With the increase of students receiving food, we have had to raise our goal from \$10,000 to \$13,000. If you would like to make a donation, or make a recurring monthly commitment to Backpack Ministry, please contact the church office or use the QR code.


