### THE GREATEST MYSTERY



"God rest ye, merry gentlemen, let nothing you dismay, remember Christ our Savior, was born on Christmas Day, to save us all from Satan's pow'r when we were gone astray. Oh tidings of comfort and joy, comfort and joy."

"God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen" has always captured my emotions and tightened my throat. How is it that Christ really saves us from ourselves? This is not only beyond my comprehension, but constitutes a powerful mystery.

We will celebrate Advent this year at St. Luke's by focusing on "The Mystery of Christmas." Indeed, the greatest mystery in all of history is unquestionably how God himself became fully human without ceasing to be fully divine — that God, in all his God-ness, united himself with all human-ness. Church history has coined it "the hypostatic union," the joining of two distinct natures in one undivided person ("hypostatic" is just a fancy word for "personal"). Jesus is fully God and fully man in one spectacular person. This is the incarnation, which literally means, the "in fleshing" of the divine Son, God Himself taking on humanity.

He really is human for our sakes; the Apostle Paul says in the book of Hebrews 2:14, "Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil—" Paul's statement summarizes the true celebration of Christmas. But let us fully ponder the beautiful mystery of this freedom from sin through Christ. Reflect on the four concepts below:

It was decided hundreds of years ago that four mysteries were true about Christ: He is 1) fully God, 2) fully man, 3) as one person in 4) two natures.

The truth of the incarnation makes a practical difference in our faith:

- 1. Jesus as "God-Man" leads us to <u>understand our own mission as Christ followers</u>. We simultaneously bow to the sovereignty of God while also rolling up our sleeves to bring love to our neighbor. Jesus did it and so do we.
- 2. <u>We matter.</u> Jesus reminds us that God has created us for dignity. We are the climactic creatures, even above angels, and our work in this world is meant to mirror Christ's mission. Jesus is not ashamed to call us brothers (Hebrews 2:11)
- **3.** The visible image of the invisible God has been established in Christ, but it <u>CONTINUES THROUGH</u> <u>US!</u> Jesus is the "lamp" which gives us light to know God's will and imitate the example of Christ. And so when Paul tells the early Christians that we will all be changed in the twinkling of an eye, we should know that occurs the minute we are new creations in Christ. For God not only worked through the body of Jesus, but God is indwelling in each one of us. May we reflect that mysterious glory.
- **4.** God has joined himself with us forever in the person of Christ. He eternally identifies with us. The question then rises: "do we identify with God?"



One of my favorite Merle Haggard songs is his 1973 hit "If We Make it through December." While the lyrics contain a measure of hope about the future beyond December, they also contain observations such as: "it's the coldest time of winter/ I shiver when I see the falling snow." The speaker ponders his "plans to be in a warmer town come summer time" while lamenting his loss of a job "down at the factory" due to a layoff. The second verse is the most poignant and captures the mixed spirit of the song:

I don't mean to hate December It's meant to be the happy time of year And my little girl don't understand Why daddy can't afford no Christmas gift

I love this song because I share in the speaker's struggle to love December and the Christmas season. I don't believe that I am alone in this struggle. I would even venture to say that many people share in the mixed bag of feelings that well-up during this time of year; that's why this song was so popular. It could be for any number of reasons: loss of job, loss of loved ones, loneliness, cold, sickness, etc. Thanks to Charles Dickens, the Christmas spirit of giving, hope, and love is in general good for our world and our communities. And, the thought of a benevolent and jolly old man dressed in a red suit bringing presents to families all over the world gathered around decorated trees and in front of warm fireplaces is touching. But, we as Christians have so much more to offer the broken-hearted and hurting than sleigh bells and reindeer. There are plenty of "little girls and boys" who "don't understand/ Why daddy can't afford no Christmas gift." There are also plenty of daddies and mommas who have lost their jobs "down at the factory" or wherever they have been working. When God wrote himself into history, he entered our world not as a king in a lush palace, but as an impoverished child sleeping in a cattle trough who grew up without "a place to lay his head" to become a "man of sorrows" who died the death of a criminal on a Roman crucifix. This Jesus is who we celebrate and offer the world; he brings meaning to our suffering because he willingly endured all of it for our sake. We can be joyful and merry about Christmas because of Him. Merry Christmas to you all.




